## PRESCHOOL SUPERVISOR CONFIDENTIAL JOB DESCRIPTION

Definition: The Kernville Union School District Preschool Supervisor shall be responsible for the administration, development, direction and coordination of the child care program.

Directly responsible to: Program Director/Superintendent

## ASSIGNED RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Ensure funding contract compliance, as well as all applicable State, County, and Federal program regulations.
- 2. Supervise and coordinate program components.
- 3. Develop and implement appropriate program and administrative policies and procedures.
- 4. Responsible for the selection, development, and supervision of staff.
- 5. Ensure ongoing compliance with licensing requirements
- 6. Responsible for the development and implementation of program curriculum
- Coordinate programs management including reports to funding source, Program Director and Agency Board.
- 8. Develop community awareness and collaborations.
- 9. Participate/assist with agency and/or parent fundraising.
- 10. Coordinate the utilization and documentation of volunteers
- 11. Assist in the development of proposals and new projects
- 12. Coordinate and supervise social services to children and families served
- 13. Coordinate staff development.
- 14. Ensure health and safety standards are met at the facility.
- 15. Additional duties as assigned.

## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Must hold a valid California Child Development Permit.
- 2. Minimum of AA (or 60 units) with 24 Early Childhood Education +6 units administration, +2 units adult supervision.
- 3. 350 days of 3+ hours per day within 4 years, including 100 days of supervising adults.
- 4. Other requirements as set by Board of Trustees
